- 1. Born, ~4 BC; Died, ~30 AD.

B. Matthew

- 1. Author Matthew (9:9-13; 10:3), though he does not identify himself as the author; "Levi," a tax collector.
- 2. Hebrew Audience (originally in Aramaic?), written early in church history (?). Compare 1:1 to Gen 2:4; 5:1, etc.

1. Author: Mark (Acts 11:30; 12:12, 25; 13:5,13; 15:37-39; II Tim 4:11; I Pet 5:13)

"...You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder'..."

- 2. Audience: Roman mind ("Latinisms," little emphasis on Jewish customs)
- 3. Character: Stresses facts & actions more than themes; forceful; action-oriented

- 1. Author: Luke, the physician (compare 1:3 to Acts 1:1, 16:10; Col 4:14, II Tim 4:11)
- 2. Audience & time of writing: To Theophilus, about 60 AD
- 3. Character
 - a. Unique events: Birth of John & Jesus, childhood, 6 unique miracles, Simeon, Anna, Zacchaeus, Herod (23:8-12); Appearance on road to Emmaus
 - b. Unique parables: Rich man & Lazarus, Prodigal Son, Good Samaritan...
 - c. Four songs/poems: Mary, Zacharias, Heavenly Host, Simeon, Pharisee & Publican
 - d. Stresses the value of disadvantaged: women, poor, sinners, Samaritans...

- 1. Biography
 - Father & Brother (Mk 3:17) -
 - Mother (compare Mt 27:56 & Mk 15:40, and see Mt 20:20) -
 - Disciple of John the Baptist? (John 1:35,40)
 - Occupation & Call (Mk 1:19) –
 - Personality (Lk 9:54; Mk 3:17; 10:35-37) –
 - Relation to Jesus (Mk 5:37; Mk 14:33; John 13:23; Mt 17:1; 19:26) –
 - Discussion of his life expectancy (John 21:20-24) -
 - John's role in the early church (Acts 3:1, 4:13, 8:14) –
- 2. John's Gospel Account
 - Author John, an eyewitness (see John 1:14, 18:15-16; 19:35; 21:24; I John 1:1-3)
 - Audience & time of writing Believers late in the first century
 - Character of the book: Written in a discourse style (a recorded sermon?), includes seven miracles and six (or 7?) feasts, and other events generally not in the other accounts. "I am" images: light, bread, water, vine, shepherd, door, describe the nature of the Son of God. Emphasizes the relationship of Jesus to the Father as a Son.
 - Seven Miracles: Water to Wine (2); Nobleman's Son (4); Man at Pool (5); Feeding 5000 (6); Walk on Water (6); Man born blind (9); Raising Lazarus (11);
 - "Complementary Account": e.g. Early Judean Teaching, Final Discourse...
 - Purpose (John 20:30-31) provide signs to create belief, to lead to life. Emphasis is on signs and how and why they created belief or unbelief in people.

Lesson 3 - Early Church History - Acts

A. Acts of the Apostles

- 1. Author and date Luke, (see Col 4:4; Phm 24; I Tim 4:11); Narrative ends in about 62 AD.
- 2. Audience Theophilus (same as Luke), Perhaps a Roman official of some rank.
- 3. Character: A historical narrative, like Luke, identifies contemporary rulers.
- 4. Purpose (cf. Lk 1:1-4 to Acts 1:1, 8) Help Theophilus (& others) "know the certainty of those things in which you were instructed," ...things "begun" in Luke (the book).
- 5. Outline (see Acts 1:8) Match the references with the events from the book of Acts.
