## Lesson 7: Sexual Morality, Part 2 – Same-Sex Relationships

**The "Modern" Challenge:** How can I talk with the people in my life who struggle with same-sex attraction?

- Remember: When talking to many people, especially teens, feelings "feel like" facts.
- Recognize: These subjects may be hard to hear, so please keep in mind that God's plans are motivated out of love.
- Readiness: One-on-one conversations are READILY available, and even when we have stumbled, love and support are available.

**The Truth:** Human sexuality is designed, created, and regulated by God for our good. It is sinful and harmful to violate God's commands. <u>People</u> need and deserve thoughtful and caring teaching on these subjects.

#### **#1.) Overview of Bible Passages**

- Abraham lived in approximately 2165 B.C. We can quickly recognize this is not a new issue.
  Sodom was guilty of many sins. See Ezekiel 16:49 along with Genesis 19:7-8. Are there any details in Genesis 19 that demonstrate homosexuality is sinful, not just rape or the lack of hospitality?
- The Law of Moses: Leviticus 18:19-23 and 20:13. Not every sin is described as an abomination, but this one is. Other sexual sins described as abominations seem to involve violating <u>multiple</u> <u>principles</u> rather than just one command. (For example, Deut. 23:18 or Deut. 24:4). What are the principles of sexual morality that are violated by same-sex relationships?
- The New Testament: What sexual relationships does Jesus approve of? (Mark 10:6-12)
- The New Testament: Carefully created objects have an intended function: A phone is for communication. A hammer is for driving nails. In Romans 1:22-32, what is the intended function or "natural function" of men and women's bodies?

How are same-sex relationships a departure from this intended function? Romans 1:22-32

• In 1 Corinthians 6:9-11, what does Jesus gladly offer to those in same-sex relationships?

### #2.) Identity: You Are NOT Your Sexual Attraction

- How did the Pharisees feel when Jesus exposed their flawed justifications? (Matt. 15:12-14)

- How has this debate affected the United Methodist Church / Global Methodist Church?
- How is it affecting churches of Christ today?
